The aggregate impact of lost time in education will be substantial, and the scale of our response must match the scale of the challenge.</p> <p>Schools' allocations are calculated on a per pupil basis, provide each mainstream school with a total of £80 per pupil in years reception through to 11. As the catch-up premium has been designed to mitigate the effects of the unique disruption caused by coronavirus (COVID-19), the grant will only be available for the 2020-21 academic year. It will not be added to the schools' baselines in calculating future years' funding allocations.</p>
